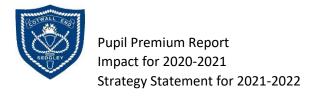

What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is additional funding provided by the Government to enhance the education of key groups. It is paid to schools for each student who:

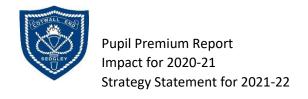
- Is recorded as being eligible for Free School Meals in the last 6 years (Ever6 FSM)
- Is looked after (CLA)
- Has a parent serving in the armed forces (SC).

Schools have the responsibility of deciding the most effective use of the funding, in order to provide additional support which will have an impact on the progress of all disadvantaged students.

Our Aim:

At Cotwall End Primary School we are committed to ensuring that students who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium achieve at least as well as their peers. The funding we receive is used for initiatives which are designed to overcome barriers to learning and further close the attainment gap.

IMPACT- 2020-2021

COVID-19

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the school being subject to restrictions as well as national lockdowns in November 2020 and January – March 2021, the KS1 and KS2 SATs were cancelled. The children's achievement was all assessed using Teacher Assessment measures. Following the original lockdown in March 2020, we carried out a baseline assessment in September 2020 to ascertain and highlight the gaps in children's achievement. This was then targeted in the interventions timetable in order to close the gaps.

EYFS Results

Due to there only being 1 in this year's EYFS cohort, we could not meaningfully analyse the data.

Children leave Reception below the national attainment targets for a Good Level of Development. The small sample size does significantly skew the figures for comparison purposes.

KS1 Results

There were 8 pupils in the cohort. This is a small sample size and again is liable to skewing. Based on the 2021 figures, 25% of these (2 pupils) each reached expected levels for Reading, Writing and Maths, and 12.5% (1 pupil) achieved this across all subjects.

KS2 Results

There were 5 children in the cohort. 100% achieved expected in Writing, 80% (4) in Reading, and 60% (3) in Maths. 60% achieved expected across all 3.

2021-2022- Provision and Strategy

Intervention	Cost	Action
Precision teaching	£5,400 p.a.	Precision Teaching is a 1-1 teaching method used to accelerate progress particularly in word reading and spelling skills. It is delivered by trained Teaching Assistants twice or three times weekly for 15 minutes all year
Additional Educational Psychologist time	£2,000 p.a.	Following the effects of the pandemic and to address childrens' mental health as a priority, we have identified extra resource to enable us to "top up" units of support purchased from the Education Psychologists at the local authority. This enables us to offer approximately 20 extra units' extra pastoral care and support for PP pupils.
Funding for extra- curricular activities	£2,500 p.a.	As these get relaunched following the pandemic restrictions, the focus on curriculum enrichment is more important than ever. Children go on a wide range of extra-curricular trips for this purpose. Funding is identified for children to access residential, overnight stays and trips linked to their topics. This involves either paying in full or offering a part payment to subsidise the overall cost.
Additional Level 3 TA to support Pastoral Needs	£21,000 p.a.	To provide support for children with social and emotional barriers to learning. More opportunities for PP children's emotional needs to be met when they may be feeling most vulnerable – i.e. nurture group, lunchtime friendship groups. Costs based on one level 3 teaching assistant plus on-costs.
Extra Teacher in Year 6 for Maths and English	£41,000 p.a.	Assistant headteacher and deputy headteacher are teaching groups with a total commitment of 0.6 FTE in order to provide targeted Mathematical and Literacy support to year 5 and year 6 groups including pupil premium children.
Increased attendance and punctuality of some pupils - Reduced % of persistent absence of PP pupils.	£2,400 p.a.	We are buying into an attendance support consultant who works with the office administrator to robustly follow up absence levels which are causing concern.
Additional Learning Support time	£20,000 p.a.	Following the school intervention map, teaching assistants are running small group interventions on a regular weekly basis, with a total commitment of 1.4FTE during term time. Costs based on Level 2 teaching assistant plus typical on-costs levels across our teaching assistants.
