

# What a Wonderful World

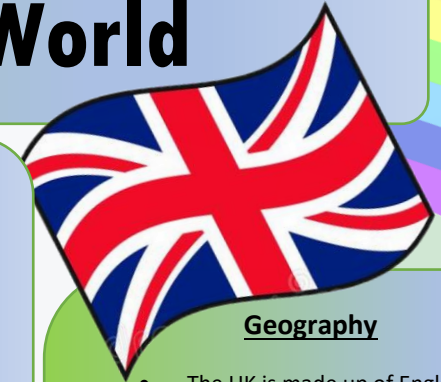
## Key Vocabulary
