- Replicate how charcoal would have been used for cave paintings.



**Neolithic** – a period of Stone Age when people started farming.

**Mesolithic** – A period of Stone Age when smaller stone tools were used.

**Doggerland** – An area of land, now submerged beneath the north Sea that connected Britain to Europe.
